

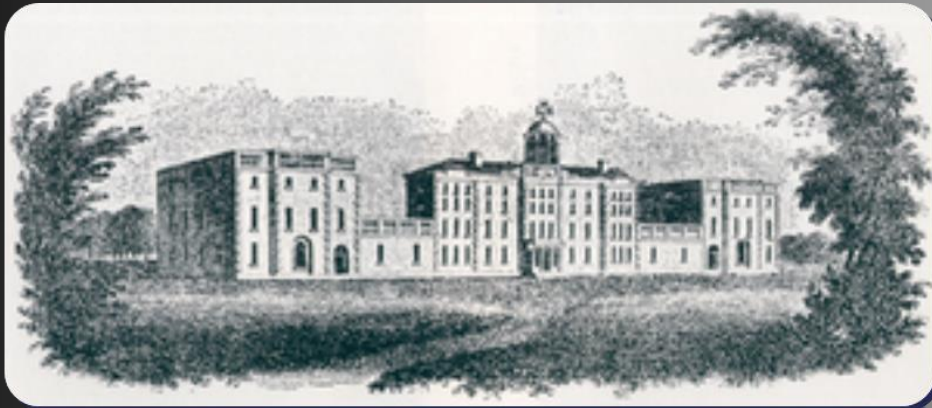

Carlow College (1782–2013)

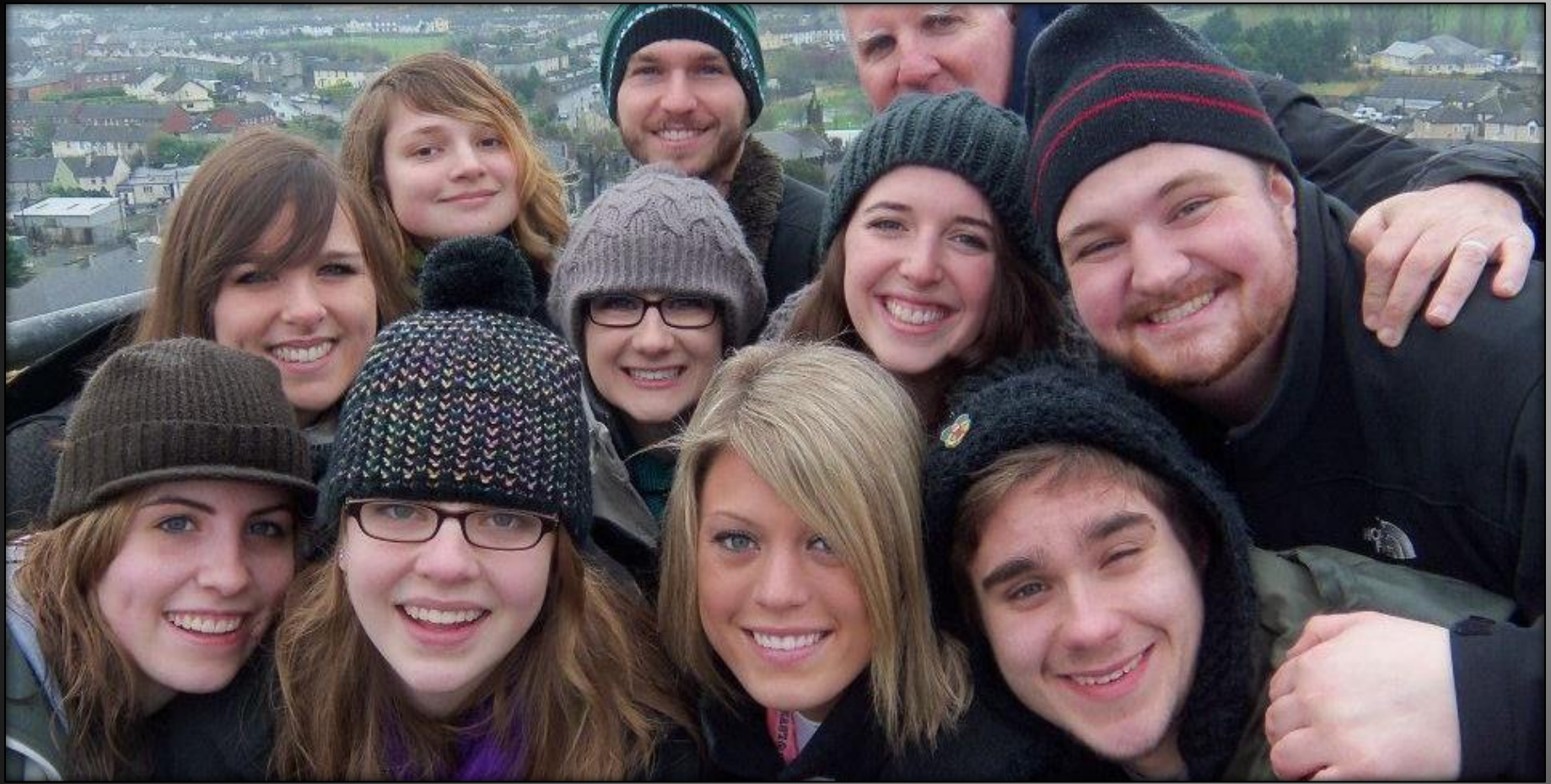


- ▶ Founded by Bishop James O'Keefe after the repeal of the Penal Laws
- ▶ Admitted first students in 1793
- ▶ Educated over 3,000 priests
- ▶ Ireland's oldest third level Catholic institution

Courses of Study at Carlow » College

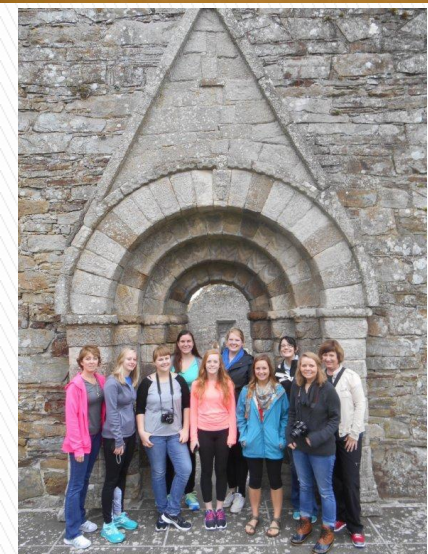
Irish Experience

- ▶ Mandatory course for every American student
- ▶ Provides an introduction to Irish life and culture
- ▶ Introduces students to important aspects of Ireland's history, political system, religious life, heritage and culture
- ▶ Broken up into two parts:
 - One hour lecture related to Irish history
 - One hour lecture related to Irish music/dance
- ▶ Every student will participate in six mandatory fieldtrips
 - Fieldtrips enhance the material covered in the Irish Experience course
 - Fieldtrips take place on Fridays
- ▶ Fieldtrips

 - Kilkenny
 - Dublin
 - Kildare
 - Wexford
 - Glendalough/Wicklow

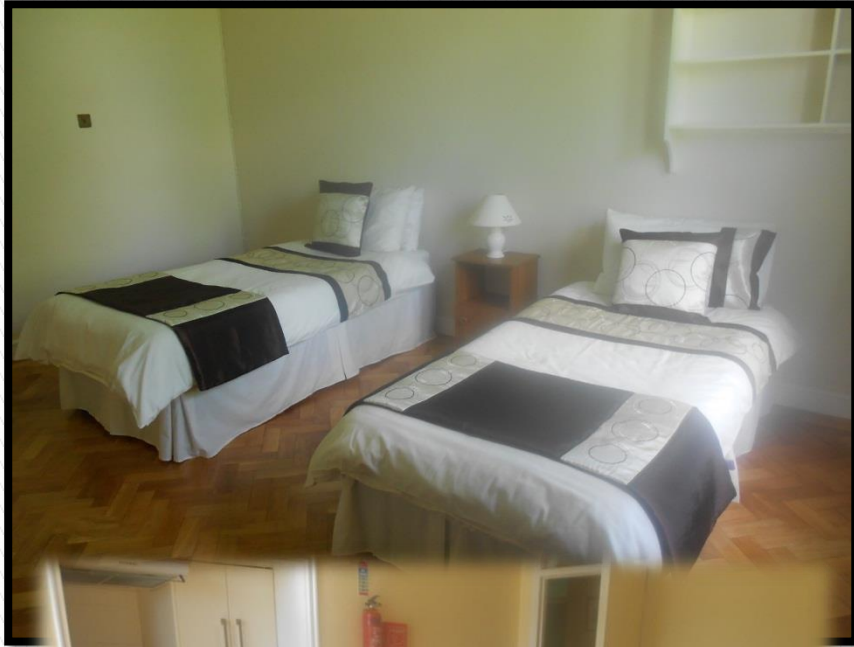

On campus accommodations



- ▶ Three / Two bedroom apartments
- ▶ Each apartment has a communal kitchen / living room (T.V., Stove, Hob, Microwave Oven, Fridge, Freezer, Kettle, Toaster & Crockery)
